Mainland China is a geopolitical term referring to the area under the jurisdiction of the People's Republic of China (PRC), excluding Hong Kong and Macau, which are under the jurisdiction of the PRC but run on different economic and political systems. Commonly known as China, it is the largest country in East Asia (3.7 million square miles) and the most populous in the world with over 1.33 billion people (approximately one-fifth of the world's population).

The PRC has administrative control over twenty-two provinces. There are also five autonomous regions, each with a designated minority group; four municipalities; and two Special Administrative Regions—Hong Kong and Macau—with considerable autonomy.

China is the world's third largest economy nominally (or second largest by purchasing power parity). Since the introduction of market-based economic reforms in 1978, China has become one of the world's fastest growing economies and the world's second largest exporter and the third largest importer of goods.

Renewables:	China's current five-year plan calls for renewables—wind, solar, biogas and hydro power—to account for 10 percent of the country's energy consumption by 2010 and 15 percent by 2020. There are 158 wind farms in China, according to the Chinese Wind Energy Association. Because land is a commodity, many of the farms are built offshore—with mixed success due to typhoons.
	Still, China is among the leaders in building wind turbine components. Leading wind equipment suppliers—Vestas, GE Energy, Gamesa, and Suzlon—have each set up wholly owned manufacturing facilities in China.
	China has more than 200 photovoltaic (PV) companies and produces approximately 18% of the photovoltaic products worldwide.
	Manufacturers include Suntech Power, solar cells and photovoltaic modules; the Yunnan Semi-conductor Parts Plant, monocrystalline cells; the Yingli Solar, polycrystalline cells and modules; the Guofei Green Energy Source, modules; and the Shanghai Poly-Vision Energy Science & Technology, modules.
	Two-thirds of its hydropower potential is untapped. The Gansu Dang River Hydropower Project consists of the construction and operation of eight run-of-river hydropower plants providing total capacity of 35.4MW.
